Karlson looks in vain for rats in Iceland even though Iceland experienced two fifteenth-century rampages of what was surely the Black Death." Scott also notes that if the Black Death was a plague then it was," a disease of rats that men participate" then as a result the plague bacillus would without uncertainty spread from rat to human when a rat dies. If that was the case then there should be have been many references to the numerous build-up in rat corpses.

Instead of the traditional theory of attributing the plague to the spread of "Yersinia Pestis" as given by Ole J. Bendictow, "The Black Death was an epidemic of bubonic plague, a disease caused by the bacterium Yersinia Pestis that circulates among wild rodents where they live in
