National Health Service, 2008 This guideline provides recommendations based on current evidence for best practice in the management of acute upper and lower GI bleeding Upper GI bleeding is that originating proximal to the ligament of Treitz in practice from the oesophagus stomach and duodenum Lower GI bleeding is that originating from the small bowel and colon This guideline focuses upon upper GI and colonic bleeding since acute small bowel bleeding is uncommon The guideline includes the assessment and management of variceal non variceal and colonic bleeding in adults The guideline deals with the management of bleeding that is of sufficient severity to lead to emergency admission to hospital Bleeding of lesser severity is subject to elective investigation and is not considered.
