according to the different models of sex and gender in which they intervene Surgeons advertise that FFS not only improves a trans woman s appearance it allows her to be recognized as a woman by those who see her In The Look of a Woman Eric Plemons foregrounds the narratives of FFS patients and their surgeons as they move from consultation and the operating room to postsurgery recovery He shows how the increasing popularity of FFS represents a shift away from genital based conceptions of trans selfhood in ways that mirror the evolving views of what is considered to be good trans medicine Outlining how conflicting models of trans therapeutics play out in practice Plemons demonstrates how FFS is changing the project of surgical sex reassignment by reconfiguring the kind of sex that surgery aims to change

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
